Prague Airport's Cargo Soars by 51% in 2024; New Routes Ahead

At Prague Airport, we witnessed an impressive surge in cargo volumes – over 66,000 tonnes were flown to/from PRG in 2024, which marks 51% growth compared to 2023. This figure does not even include cargo on RFS. In 2025, we expect to grow even further with new long-haul destinations, such as Toronto (Air Canada), Seoul (Asiana Airlines), and Abu Dhabi (Etihad Airways).
